

Here are some examples of how your gift is invested in the local community.

A gift of \$3 per week provides:

- 3 days/nights camp experience at Boy Scouts' Camp Norse Cub World
- 10 individuals with disabilities the opportunity to play on a basketball team for three months
- 1 week of Nature Camp for an underprivileged child
- 2 youth memberships at the YMCA
- 1 teen membership at the YMCA
- 2 weeks rent at the YMCA
- 1 week of craft classes for 12 children at the Boys & Girls Club
- A comprehensive diagnostic evaluation for counseling services for a teenager with substance abuse problems
- 4 home care aide visits to attend to the personal care needs of the patient
- 3 hours of primary and preventative health care to 3 to 5 uninsured adults
- 10-12 new books for "Kid Lit" program for elementary school girls
- Annual participation for two teens in the YMCA Teen Center
- Consultation with school administrator and faculty about grief
- 17 hours of individual tutoring for an adult learning to read or speak English or 22 hours of classroom instruction for an adult student seeking a GED to go on to college or training
- 9 days of child care for a school age child from a low-income working family
- 6 parenting support and education classes to a family
- One week's groceries for families in shelter fleeing from domestic violence
- Several weeks of homework supplies for 15 children
- A mentor for 1 week with intensive case management services
- An educational video for a Turning Point group, with up to 10 male adolescent participants
- 1 youth and 1 high school membership at the YMCA
- 6 months of monthly follow along contact with a disabled person placed in a job.
- 26 hours of applied learning/internship for 1 student in Project Achieve, an MCAS tutoring and job training program for high school students

A gift of \$5 per week provides:

- A weekend activity for a ScoutReach unit, such as a camp-in at the Boston Museum of Science
- 6 children with physical disabilities to attend an adaptive ski program
- 2 weeks of Camp Finberg for an underprivileged child
- 3 children to participate in Sneaker's childcare program for 3 weeks
- 1 senior citizen membership at the YMCA
- 1 young adult membership at the YMCA
- 1 membership for Y resident to help them begin a healthy lifestyle
- 4 weeks of Kinder Scouts Camp at Camp Finberg for 1 child
- 8 weeks of summer programs for 1 child
- A psychological evaluation for a child with special needs
- 3 nursing visits to instruct a newly diagnosed diabetic patient on how to administer insulin injections
- 5.75 hours of primary and preventative health care to 5 to 8 uninsured adults
- Scholarships for 2 underprivileged girls or young women to attend Girls Inc. for an entire school year
- 2 weeks of day camp

- Crisis intervention at schools and organizations
- 14 weeks of classroom instruction for one student in Adult Education
- 2 1/2 weeks of child care for a preschool child from a low-income working family
- 1 month of GoodStart services for a family
- Hospital-based SANE medical advocacy and crisis intervention services for a teen or adult who was raped
- 10 weeks of substance abuse and violence prevention activities for 15 youth
- 10 one-to-one mentor-matched children with a social or recreational activity
- A parents' group support session
- 2-week session of summer camp for 1 child
- 1 week of evaluation or vocational training services to a person with a disability
- 1 week of applied learning/internship for 5 students in Project Achieve, an MCAS tutoring and job training program for high school students

A gift of \$7 per week provides:

- A week-long Day Camp program during summer vacation, including transportation, for 2 campers
- 5 weeks of art instruction for an individual with significant physical needs
- 2 weeks of Camp, plus before and after camp childcare for a child of working parents
- subsidizes swim lessons for 8 weeks for children in the Sneakers day care program
- 1 single adult membership at the YMCA
- staff leadership for 8 weeks of Outer Limits program
- 5 weeks rent at the YMCA
- 2 children to participate in youth basketball league for 4 sessions each
- Allow low-income disabled clients the opportunity to sign up for a class, or go on a day trip with their volunteer friend.
- a 10-week learn to swim program for 4 children
- 3 crisis intervention sessions for a family coping with the death of a parent
- 2 social worker visits to set up and coordinate community resources for a patient or family
- 2 full afternoons of health care to 14 uninsured adults
- New school supplies for homework center including dictionaries, pencils, rulers, paper, etc.
- 1 family membership at the YMCA
- Four children at Caring Kids Camp Weekend
- 1 year of individual tutoring for one student learning to speak or read English or 2 weeks of classroom instruction for group of 12 students, 6 hours/week
- 2 weeks of childcare for an infant from a low-income working family
- a developmental play group for 10 families
- 4 weekly counseling support groups for up to 10 women seeking help with domestic and sexual violence
- 8 weeks of self-sufficiency programming for adults
- 1 week of summer camp for 3 youth
- 6 clinical consultations to area schools regarding male adolescents at-risk of violence
- 10 swimming lessons for an underprivileged youth
- 1 year of monthly follow along contact with a disabled person placed in a job.
- 1 week of applied learning/internship for 7 students in Project Achieve, an MCAS tutoring and job training program for high school students

A gift of \$10 per week provides:

- An over-night camp-out at Six Flags for a ScoutReach Venture Crew
- A week of respite care for a parent of a child with a disability
- 4 weeks of Camp Finberg for a deserving child
- 1 family membership at the YMCA
- food and refreshments for 5 months of Get Out Nights program
- 24 hours of casework services for a YMCA resident

- 1 month of internet access for 400 children
- 20 group therapy sessions for a man with schizophrenia
- 6 patients could receive a physical or occupational therapy assessment for home safety evaluation and recommendations
- 3 full afternoons of health care to 21 uninsured adults
- Design and print of new promotional materials including flyers, brochures, and posters, to increase enrollment
- 7 weeks of after school childcare
- Books and videos for community resource library
- training for 10 new volunteer tutors
- a summer of child care for a school age child from a low-income working family
- 2 months of GoodStart services for a family
- Legal advocacy services to 4 individuals in need of restraining orders
- 10-week pregnancy prevention/self-esteem empowerment program for 30 youth
- 2 group mentoring activities for all youth on the waiting list (currently 35)
- 12-week Turning Point group experience for a community teen who had been, or was at-risk to become violent
- 7 youth memberships for underprivileged children
- 2 weeks of evaluation or vocational training services to a person with a disability
- 1 week of applied learning/internship for 11 students in Project Achieve, an MCAS tutoring and job training program for high school students

A gift of \$15 per week provides:

- A ScoutReach division-wide event, such as the Annual Pinewood Derby
- 50 individuals with developmental disabilities to participate in a theme dance
- A summer of Leadership Training for a young teen
- subsidizes part time childcare for 6 months
- 2 single-parent family memberships at the YMCA
- 95% of the cost for 2 single-parent memberships for families involved in the Outer Limits program
- 11 weeks rent at the YMCA
- 5 sessions of Y Way Play for 1 child from September through June
- Allows 75 children to take part in afterschool recreation programs for 1 week
- 7 individual counseling sessions for an elderly woman coping with a debilitating physical health problem
- 32 hours of home care aide services for a frail elder patient, helping them remain independent and living in their own homes
- 6 weeks of smoking cessation counseling for 10-15 smokers and 6 hours of health care to 8 to 10 uninsured adults
- Salary for an instructor to teach self-defense to 4th and 5th grade girls in the "Action for Safety Program"
- 6 weeks of preschool childcare
- Consultant for 6-week specialized support group
- 1 teacher aide within the classroom for one quarter (14 weeks)
- 5 1/2 weeks of child care for a toddler from a low-income working family
- 3 months of GoodStart services for a family
- 3 weeks of coverage by a trained Crisis Intervention Specialist to provide crisis intervention, counseling, support and referrals on its 24-hour domestic and sexual assault hotline
- 6 months of culturally and linguistically appropriate community advocacy for adults and youth to address educational and vocational goals
- 1 week of summer camp for 7 youth
- Several hundred parents with a Parent Educational Manual on teen dating violence
- 3 single-parent family memberships at the YMCA
- 6 months of weekly instruction on community work and living skills for a disabled person

- 1 week of applied learning/internship for 16 students in Project Achieve, an MCAS tutoring and job training program for high school students

A gift of \$20 per week provides:

- Supports a patrol of ScoutReach Boy Scouts to attend Summer Camp
- 10 adaptive devices to increase independence and self-preservation skills
- An entire summer of fun at Camp Finberg for a deserving child
- 2 months of child care for a child in the Sneaker's program
- 2 full family memberships
- 5 field trips to the Pawtucket Red Sox for Get Out Night participants
- 15 weeks rent at the Y
- 1 youth to register for 17 Y programs throughout the year
- 1 month of child care services for 2 pre-school children
- 2 days of school-based counseling and critical incident debriefing following a serious episode of school violence
- Underwrites an entire 3-day training by the Community Crisis Intervention team.
- 2 weeks of daily nursing visits to perform wound care for a patient
- 6 weeks of smoking cessation counseling for 10-15 smokers and 3 full afternoons of health care to 21 uninsured adults
- Special event including family activities, dinner and social activities
- 1 day of Ropes Course programming for an entire eighth grade class
- Monthly mailings to bereaved families for 13 months
- training for 20 new volunteer tutors
- 4 1/2 months of before and after school care for a school age child from a low-income working family
- 4 months of GoodStart services for a family
- One day's operation of the Southeast emergency shelter for up to 6 women and their children
- 6 months of intensive, individualized home-based parenting and self-sufficiency support for 3 families
- A mentor for 8 weeks with intensive case management services
- A mass mailing and extensive distribution of an updated Turning Point brochure
- 2 months of childcare service for a low-income family
- 1 month of evaluation or vocational training services to a person with a disability
- 1 week of applied learning/internship for 22 students in Project Achieve, an MCAS tutoring and job training program for high school students
